

Equal Pay Day — which takes place Tuesday, April 4, this year — is the symbolic day when women's pay finally "catches up" to the wages that men took home the previous year. The date represents the fact that women working full time, yearround in the United States typically are paid just 80 percent of what men are paid, or a gap of 20 percent. (AAUW also observes the equal pay days in March for Asian American women, in August for African American women, in September for Native American women, and in October for Latina women.)

Most people have heard of the gender pay gap, but not everyone understands what it means or how deeply it affects women, from student debt to motherhood to leadership barriers.

How can we play a role in consciousnessraising and agent for change? Here are a few ideas from AAUW:

Don't leave money on the table! Our <u>AAUW Start Smart and Work Smart</u> <u>programs</u> empower women with skills and confidence to successfully negotiate their starting salaries, raises, or promotions. By learning key strategies, participants gain valuable skills they can use throughout their lives — and the monetary benefits add up over time.

Another cost-effective way to raise awareness for equal pay is to utilize traditional and social media channels. Your media efforts can lead to new members, access to key stakeholders and decision makers, and increased visibility in your community. All it takes is time! Write a letter to the editor or an op-ed to your local paper talking about the need for pay equity in your state and the country.

Send a message to Congress urging action to close loopholes in existing federal law and strengthen protections for working women.

Those of us in this branch may not be in the work force any more but we can recall what it was like for us AND we can help our future economic leaders.....strong women!!
