Reproductive Rights Rally in Little Rock

On January 18, 2014, six members of the Hot Springs/HSV branch of AAUW attended the ACRJ (Arkansas Coalition for Reproductive Justice) Rally on the steps of the Capitol. Also in attendance were AAUW members from both the Little Rock and Fayetteville branches. At the AAUW booth, Paula Mathews helped answer questions about our organization, passed out brochures, and brought awareness to the strong women's rights work that AAUW has done. Invocation was given by Rabbi Barry Block of Temple B'nai Israel. About 400 people of all ages heard inspiring words from Bowen Law School Professor Adjoa Aiyetoro, AR State Representative Fred Love, and ACLU Staff Attorney Holly Dickson. Rally vicechair and co-president of UCA's Feminist Union, Greer Williams, closed the program with a poetry performance.

Many attendees signed postcards to our Representatives supporting sex education and reproductive justice. An After-Rally party was held at Vino's Pizza and Pub where we networked and spread the message of HS/HSV AAUW.
