

On Saturday morning, the convention was opened with a greeting from Kristy Carter, Executive Director, Outreach & Community Engagement, University of Central Arkansas. Imagine our delight when she announced to the group that she had been an AAUW scholarship recipient in Hot Springs!

Kristy gave us a copy of the newspaper clipping where she is pictured as Kristy Watkins with the two other recipients that year - 1999, when three \$900 scholarships were awarded. The article states: "Kristy Watkinsplans to complete her Associate's Degree and transfer to Henderson State University to work toward a master of education degree. 




HS/HSV Branch Receives 7 Diamonds in State Award
