### 2014 BOOK SALE RESULTS

Our October Book Sale profits were \$10,001 (books sold, donations and the gift basket raffle) plus \$2,900 from the sale of posters! Sorting work and setting up for the sale itself was accomplished by 55 women who contributed 354 hours and 7 men who gave us 61 hours of labor. We had a total of 902 boxes of books to sell. 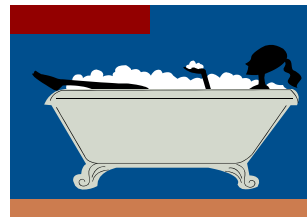
## PUT ME ON YOUR 2015 CALENDAR
