ANNUAL BOOK SALE NEWS

As was expected from the smaller number of buyers, the income from the sale itself was down in all categories (pre-sales, sale, bag sale) compared to last year with the total \$9719 compared to \$12,035 last year.

HOWEVER the better news:

The raffle brought in \$1483, which is \$274 more than last year, and we received \$300 in donations from members, to make a grand total from the book sale \$11,502, which is \$1,742 less than last year. The expenses were less this year so that the Net from the sale is \$10,800, which is only \$1,286 less than last year.

Now the Good news:

The poster project (Kudos to Marge Collin and Becky Gifford) brought in \$3,050, so the total is \$13,850 which is \$1764 MORE than last year!!!
