As new years begin, they allow us to make some changes. This year we are thrilled to launch our new branch website, Facebook page, and Twitter feed. You'll be hearing much more about these social media tools in the coming months. For now, I'm asking that you make only one resolution - to get accustomed to checking the website for information about branch activities and actions.

We will continue to produce the Hot Sheet - and a big thanks to Carol Freeland for agreeing to be the editor. However, we will be able to reduce the size and scope of the Hot Sheet by putting the on-going branch information on the webpage - and a big thanks to Ronnie Zuege for creating and maintaining this valuable tool. Because we want to attract new members, we need a presence on social media. Paula Alan also deserves a big thank you for agreeing to take charge of our Facebook and Twitter accounts. Of course, Carol, Ronnie, and Paula need input from the rest of us to keep our web presence upto-date.

So what else is new? This year we have two Presidents and two Book Sale chairs.

Karen Dolan and Mary Kay Benkert have stepped in to manage the branch's biggest fundraiser - a big job with major benefits - especially to our scholarship recipients. E-books have taken their toll on the number of actual books that people donate and buy. Therefore, we are supplementing our book sale fundraising by selling corporate and individual sponsorships (a big thanks to Marg Collin and Becky Gifford for heading up this effort) and by organizing raffle sales.

Having co-presidents means that Paula Mathews and I are taking responsibility for different areas. As you can see, I will write the Presidents' column for the Hot Sheet. I will also run the general meetings, focus on internal branch projects and programming, and be involved in the book sale activities. Paula will focus more on external matters and will be the main interface to the state and national organizations. In addition, she will run the Board Meetings, be involved with the Scholarship Committee, and assist Meg Koziar with financial issues and funding. Obviously, there will be some overlap and possibly some matters that we have not yet anticipated. But be sure, we are both committed to making sure that the Branch continues to prosper.

We are also making some changes to the format of the general meetings. Lunch will continue to be part of the October meeting that is held in conjunction with the Hot Springs Documentary Film

Festival and the December scholarship luncheon. However, the other general meetings will not include lunch. This is in response to concerns raised by some of the members that the cost of the lunches made them reluctant to attend the meetings. As a result, the other meetings will begin at 10 am for coffee, tea, pastries, and socializing, followed by the talk by our guest speaker and a brief membership meeting. After the meeting, those who want to continue over lunch are free to do so; those who have other commitments are free to leave. We welcome your feedback on these changes.
