We are pleased to host a Zoom meeting featuring Rhiannon Zerbe, a registered nurse at UAMS, who will speak to us about "Providing for Equity of Care Through Innovative Digital Technologies" on January 27 at 4 p.m.

Her presentation is about how UAMS is utilizing digital technologies to offer healthcare specialties to patients that might not otherwise have access. Rhiannon said her discussion mainly focuses on UAMS' very successful stroke program, as well as the newest program that gives sexually assaulted patients access to expert level care.

Rhiannon is a registered nurse, currently working as a sexual assault outreach nurse and educator with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS) Institute for Digital Health and Innovation (IDHI) Digital Health Sexual Assault Assessment Program.

She began her career as an Army combat medic and went on to obtain her RN in her home state of Kansas. Most of her career has been within the emergency department.

Rhiannon is passionate about the outdoors. She loves to hike, backpack, trail run, paddle board, and mountain bike. If she is not outdoors, then you can find her at home relaxing with her wife Catina and her little dog, Ziggy.

Because of Rhiannon's love for life, she is determined to help those who have experienced a sexual assault. She discovered during her first sexual assault forensic examination that care for

the patient requires the utmost specialization. She finds it beyond rewarding to make sure she does the absolute best for the patient in order to aid them through their healing journey.

Rhiannon said, "I'm so happy and thankful to have the opportunity to speak about programs that change the lives of those they touch, and to get the word out there so that more people are aware of what is offered."
