IT'S SPRING....SO IT MUST BE SCHOLARSHIP TIME!

Thanks to the generosity of so many of you, we once again have \$15,000 in scholarship money to distribute for the 2022-2023 academic year.

Applications for the are currently being collected online by the NPC financial aid department. An interview team of five from the scholarship committee will conduct in-person interviews April 20 and 21.

Our scholarships are given to NPC women and to women who are transferring from NPC to another accredited college or university in Arkansas. The applicants must show a GPA of at least 3.0 and be a full time student. Heavy consideration is given to need, long-term goals and the required references from faculty and employers. Although the scholarship award is for a full academic year, funds are released by semester with proof of full time enrollment and grades.

GET INVOLVED!

Recently, at a monthly meeting while listening to a presentation from Last Chances. Period, a group that works to supply young women with free feminine hygiene products, AAUW Little Rock learned that feminine hygiene products are taxed at a very high rate, relative to other products you buy in the grocery store. Food is taxed at 1.5%. Depending on where you live in Arkansas, you may pay as much as 11% (state, local tax) or more.

We were shocked. We want to see the tax in feminine products reduced or even eliminated. Nell Matthews (AAUW LR and AAUW Arkansas) has asked for help from her legislators (Rep. Tippi McCollough and Sen. Clarke Tucker) in crafting a resolution to be presented to the Citizens First Congress (AAUW AR is a member) for selection on the priority platform at the June convention. This way the power of the CFC is behind efforts to get the tax removed or at least reduced by the state (6%).

If you would like to help, we will need many co-sponsors of the legislation, in both the house and senate. We need support to get this elected as a priority at the CFC convention June 24. We will need a campaign to bring this issue to the front of people's minds and into their conversations. It is time we stopped being ashamed of our biology and talked openly about the need, especially for girls and young women.
